Members could only hope that they could still reach their homeland before a lockdown would come into

force. Fortunately, all went well and no one was left behind.



Thanks to the tremendous effort of Mrs Weger and Mrs Tomasitz-Möseneder, the costs of the conference were not too high this time and for that reason we were able to refund the conference fee to those that had not been able to participate.

At this moment we cannot look forward into our crystal ball, but I sincerely hope that we will be able to meet again in person in Eger, Hungary, next year.

### Attention: Decision of the AGM regarding work-placements abroad

In order to facilitate EBBDstudents in graduating the AGM has decided the following procedure:

- Instead of an international work placement students can fulfil their internship in an international company in their own country, if the students have the opportunity to speak in a foreign language, have meetings (also via Skype, Teams or Zoom) with foreign customers, etc.
- Students that were on an internship abroad already during the outbreak of the corona crisis, but had to return due to regulations of their national governments and who had not yet fully met the four-week-requirements shall be considered to have met these requirements. They do not

need to do extra internship hours at home or abroad.

In the situation where specific conditions apply the Steering Committee member of the respective country will further define the requirements in agreement with the EBBD e.V. board, if necessary.

- We also started to enrich the EBBD portfolio by showcasing different possible forms for the implementation of work-based learning (WBL), thus focusing future employability even more.
- And, last but not least, we have already compiled a number of helpful and illustrative best practice examples of our partners for creating guidelines that facilitate the cooperation of EBBD colleges with stakeholders as well as informing and guiding

students and parents. In this context our meeting with Arja Krauchenberg from the European Parents
Association (EPA) was particularly fruitful and we hope to further this cooperation on (inter-) national and regional levels.
