
Update of the EBBD prime project

The EBBD prime project was finalized during the last project meeting in Barcelona.

Accreditation Tool:

After testing the beta version of the accreditation tool, it was improved in order to further facilitate the accreditation for colleges. The format for describing the implementation of the different Learning Units is now standardized, easy to apply for the applicant and also easy to check for the verifier.





Berufliches Schulzentrum Odenwaldkreis, Germany, welcomes EBBD students from Skive College, Denmark

From March 26 through April 8, 2022, the students and teachers from Berufliches Schulzentrum Odenwaldkreis in Michelstadt, Germany, were happy to have nine students from Skive College, Denmark, as their guests as part of their EBBD program "Living, Studying and Working in Europe." A school tour helped the guest students find their way around during their two weeks stay.

The Danish students participated in various school lessons of the German students. Special school lessons represented the power point presentations of the business ideas of the German EBBD students in their entrepreneurship project. In the following feedback the students exchanged their views on the topic. Also special were the multicultural groups lessons in which all students learned about G. Hofstede's cultural dimensions and had lively discussions in English and German.

In the German school's own Learning and Research Center the guest students from Denmark had fun trying out some different digital devices. Moreover, the German banker trainees had prepared presentations in English to introduce the German dual training system using the example of the training to become a bank clerk to the Danish guest students.

A cultural and sporting highlight was the bicycle tour through Michelstadt and its surrounding area. Also, the students took a guided tour of Michelstadt on foot and got to know interesting historical facts about buildings and castles dating back to the Middle Ages.

Special highlights outside school were the guided factory tour and presentation of the company Koziol GmbH in Erbach by its owner and manager Mr. Stephan Koziol and the visit of the Money Museum and the German Central Bank in Frankfurt am Main where the German and Danish students attended a lecture on the Monetary Policy of the Eurosystem.

After all the events in- and outside of school the Danish and German students always had plenty of opportunity to enjoy cultural and social life in and outside Michelstadt.

The German and Danish teachers agreed to cooperate on more projects in the future, broadening the basis of cooperation and looking forward to it.
