In May board members EBBD e.V. visited Brussels and in June we had some more online sessions with experts from the European Union. Experts we met and who took time to listen and hear about EBBD and inspire us with their expertise and thoughts: Policy officer Ulrike Pi<u>siotis</u>, from the Commission's Directorate General for Education, Youth, Sport and Culture, coauthor of the GreenComp. She introduced us how to integrate sustainability in EBBD and linked us to the Community of Practice in sustainability. Brenda Maher, project officer for Jean Monnet, Unit DG for Education and Culture. She definitely gave us 'food for thought' on possibilities in the Jean Monnet actions for networks. Joep Bresser policy advisor at Neth-er, on the following topics VET (EVETA, Kopenhagen, Centres of Vocational Excellence), skills comparison (EQF), quality care recognition, Life Long Learning, Joep linked us to the experts, walked us through the current developments in the EU and supported us by visualizing with us the next steps for EBBD.

The 5th transnational project meeting in Gorges, France on the 10th and 11th of May 2023



This Erasmus+ KA2 project found its origin in the need of six EBBD colleges to find different ways to have their students work together in an international environment. For this the EDP project was set up: to develop a framework and subsequently a handbook – to make it possible for students from different countries and nationalities to cooperate in a business simulation project.

In order to reach that goal, partners' best practices were observed and analyzed in various transnational meetings and from that a framework was developed to be tested during a physical LTT (Learning, Teaching, Training) meeting in San Sebastian in October 2023. For that meeting 6 students from each of the respective countries will be selected and they will be working in international teams.

The partners are finalizing the framework developed in order to help the schools to implement a business game into their business and entrepreneurial studies. The host Charles-Peguy school presented one of their practices, an entrepreneurship competition. The best practices presented in each meeting allow the schools to discuss, exchange opinions on it and find improvements or ideas for the framework and the next LTT meeting.

Helsinki Business College from Finland coordinates this inventive project. The partners are–Rijn Ijssel and Summa College from the Netherlands, Nazaret Fundazioa college from Spain, Charles Peguy from France and Skive College from Denmark.

All participants are accredited as EBBD colleges (European Business Behaviour and Democracy). This means that they must fulfill the excellence requirements of EBBD and their students can get the Certificate of Excellence.

From Rags to Riches? Not without marketing! And not without teamwork!

In the beginning of April, grade 12 EBBD – students from BSZ 1 Leipzig finished their crosscultural project with focus on market analysis in co-operation with fellow students from our French partner school "Lycée Ampère" in Lyon.

Under the project title "Launching a French Product Successfully Into the German Market" the students examined and reviewed collaboratively how, when and under what conditions such a product launch would be possible.

The bi-national project started in January, with different phases of classroom learning as well as online group work. Thus, blended learning ensured a self-determined, time- and practice-oriented elaboration, facilitating topic- as well as cultural-related experiences.

The projects' finalisation took place in Lyon where the students met to summarize their findings and to introduce their ideas to an



experts' jury. The students worked hard to swap ideas and form a prosperous marketing concept. All participating students agreed that working in a cross-cultural group gave them the opportunity to get to know different perspectives and opinions. They supported and inspired each other to achieve best results. A key takeaway for all participants was the importance of communicating efficiently in a foreign language and that teamwork is THE solution to be successful.

International Seminar -Well-being at Work 2023

On Monday 6th of March 2023, **Business College Helsinki** welcomed 80 students and teachers from various EU countries for a twoweek seminar. To get to know each other the students gave presentations about their countries to familiarize the rest of us with cities, architecture and traditions of the Netherlands, Spain, France, Austria and Germany. The hosting Finnish students shared specific traits, and very importantly, some fun facts about Finland. The day ended with a Finnish language lesson, teaching everyone the basic, useful words for the stay in Finland.

On Wednesday, 8th of March, the college auditorium was packed as the International Seminar about Well-being at Work was held.

Anni Vuohijoki, who is a professional weightlifter, medical doctor and an entrepreneur, told us how to let go of fear and be shamelessly good at what you do. It was a truly inspiring and motivational talk. Then it was Tiina Hoffman from Firstbeat who talked about the importance of keeping track of your body's data and about ways of relieving anxiety by having an everyday schedule and good quality sleep. Mare Oravainen gave a speech about unique recovery technologies implemented in Cryotech Finland. Last but not least, Anni Havas presented the app Cuckoo, which helps the users to stay active and take short breaks during workdays. In the end, everyone got a chance to try out the app by doing a dance workout. The whole seminar was also streamed online.

The rest of the week was dedicated to various outdoor and indoor activities like city orienteering and sightseeing. We even played beach volleyball which felt like being on a vacation right by the sea even though we didn't have to fly anywhere to experience it! On Friday the guests together with our teachers took a ferry to Tallin to discover its Old Town and enjoy the historic atmosphere.

The second week was full of excursions: trip to Suomenlinna Fortress, chocolate factory Fazer Experience Centre and company visits to Suunto, Neurosonic and Cryotech.
